Established in the room behind the Kings Head Pub in 1970, for 53 years the theatre has been a pioneer and leader of London's Fringe. The Kings Head Theatre has been a breeding ground for new talent and exciting works. Renowned actors such as Maureen Lipman, Hugh Grant, Jennifer Saunders, Dawn French, Alan Rickman and Richard E Grant have all performed here and a number of our productions have transferred to the West End from writers such as Tom Stoppard, Steven Berkoff, Bryony Lavery and Victoria Wood.

Today the theatre is a predominantly LGBTQIA+ space, celebrating work made for, with, by and about the LGBTQIA+ community. Our artistic policy is: joyful, irreverent, colourful and queer and we strive to programme a broad range of artforms covering the gamut of plays, musicals, opera, stand-up comedy, drag, cabaret and the intersections between. You're always bound to find something that is entertaining and alternative.

In January this year, we opened the doors to our brand new 200+ seat theatre and cabaret space, along with bars and flexible rehearsal spaces at 116P Upper Street, in the new Islington Square redevelopment. Here we plan to continue the legacy of the pub theatre and it is an incredibly exciting time to join us as we move into this new phase of the organisation's development.

Job Description

We are seeking a motivated and skilled full time Technician to join our theatre team alongside the Technical Supervisor, Technical Manager and Duty Managers. The ideal candidate will have a passion for delivering exceptional production quality and a strong understanding of technical theatre operations. As the Technician, you will oversee daily technical and production duties, including rehearsals, get ins/outs, building and equipment maintenance and management of show calls as the Duty Technician.

This position will be primarily working on show calls including evenings and weekends.

We especially encourage applicants with a sound bias, but we are open to considering candidates with a range of skills who we believe would be a great fit for our team.

Key Responsibilities:

Building Technician:

- Ensure regular cleaning, testing, and maintenance of lighting, sound, and AV equipment and perform routine maintenance tasks
- Report malfunctioning technical equipment and undertake PAT Testing and maintain up-to-date inventory lists for functioning and non-functioning equipment.
- Prepare LX and sound equipment for technical rehearsals
- Monitor and report stock levels (First Aid kits, bulbs, cables, etc.)
- Support the Technical and Production manager in completing stage and auditorium maintenance
- Provide IT support for computers and internet use throughout the building
- Prepare technical requirements for incoming companies and in-house shows
- Support show teams during tech rehearsals, especially late shows and events
- Assist cabaret acts with programming technical requirements in advance of performances
- Support the Technical & Production Manager during build periods and technical rehearsals
- Lead or assist with rigging, focusing, plotting, and programming equipment
- Ensure venue safety and compliance with health & safety standards



- Perform basic maintenance tasks (painting, repairs, etc.)
- Assist with casual Technician scheduling based on show demands
- Serve as a key holder, opening the venue for scheduled visitors and rehearsals
- Welcome visiting companies during get-ins and conduct safety briefings
- Support the production team during get-ins, technical rehearsals, and previews

Duty Technician (Show Calls):

- Open and close the theatre around showtimes.
- Conduct rig checks and support stage management during shows.
- Perform daily cleaning and administrative tasks.
- Complete Duty Tech reports nightly.
- Assist customers with seating and general inquiries.
- Serve as the face of the organisation for customers.
- Participate in general duties within the Theatre Team, including ushering and box office responsibilities.

Health & Safety:

- Ensure adherence to health & safety best practices within the building.
- Enforce health & safety procedures for staff, artists, and audiences.
- Act as a first aider for the organisation.
- Support training for staff on fire and health & safety procedures.
- Champion environmental sustainability initiatives and best practices.

General

- Attend technical rehearsals, dress rehearsals, Previews, Press and Supporter Nights and other events as required
- Attend regular company meetings and department meetings
- Actively develop and implement green policies for the department
- Adhere to, and actively contribute to, all in-house policies
- To maximise income and minimise expenditure wherever possible, without jeopardising the quality of work or reputation of the theatre
- Always act in the best interest of the theatre
- Be an advocate of the theatre's programme of events and ethos
